Our Family of Winemakers

Familia Cassone – Family owned and operated on over 100 year old vineyards. Bodega Familia Cassone is founded on three cornerstones: quality of product, quality of people and quality of relationships. Originally from Piamonte in Italy, the family came to Argentina at the start of the 1900's. Eduardo's father Roberto bought his first vineyard in the 1950's and he passed on his love and respect for the land to Eduardo. Eduardo and his sons built a new winery and most of his vineyards are located in the place known as the Primera Zone (First Area) for making first quality wines. From wine picking to making to selling – this is a true family run business with all three generations included in the day – to – day running of the business.

Te Pa – Founder and owner Haysley MacDonald traces his ancestry back to the early Maori settlers who landed on Wairau Bar 800 years ago. He has traced his heritage back to ancestors who have worked the land for generations. In 2003 Haysley and his family started a new adventure, converting their dairy and crop farm into vineyards and in 2011 Te Pa Was born. Along with his partner, children and parents they are as connected to the land as their ancestors were, with the same commitments – respect for the land, keeping simple things in balance and to be proudly independent. Looking after the land that has sustained Haysley's family for generations, is important to Te Pa's operations today. Their commitment as kaitiaki (guardians/caretakers of the land) is brought to life through their sustainability programme.

Siegel Wines – Alberto Siegel was a winegrower in charge of well-known vineyards. Later he studied agronomy and acquired experience in some wine cellars in Germany. Vina Siegel has more than 700 hectares planted with vineyards distributed in seven lands. They search for vines with identity and quality and have a strong dedication for details and service. They produce wines with a futuristic vision, according to their consumers taste, protecting the environment and they care about their human capital, conserving the natural surrounding of their lands.

Rocca / Dezzani Winery – At the end of the 1900's Francesco Rocca started his historical business buying bulk wine. In 1936 his son Angelo enhanced the wine production and built up a cellar in Nardo, Apulia. In the 1960's Ernesto Rocca, Angelo's son, bought the first bottling line and started the distribution of products under the Rocca brand. In 1999, infatuated with Apulia and vines, he bought a farm in Leverano, in the heart of Salento. In 2009, Rocca family became the major shareholder of the historical winery Dezzani in Piedmont realizing new commercial and productive synergies. Ernesto's sons and grandsons share all duties and responsibilities and they represent proudly the fifth generation in the wine world.

Berton Winery – Started as a dream in 1996 when Bob and Cherie Berton planted their first wines in the rugged, beautiful slopes of High Eden in the Barossa Valley. In 2005 they along with the Ceccato and Bennet families acquired a historic winery in Yenda, New South Wales. This allowed them to expand their craft, processing grapes from some of Australia's most renowned wine regions. Every grape is carefully selected and every batch meticulously fermented to bring out the best in each variety, making Berton Vineyards a name synonymous with quality.

Sustainability is at the heart of everything Berton Vineyard does from using lightweight, eco-friendly bottles to innovative winemaking techniques that reduce energy and water usage, they are committed to protecting the environment while producing exceptional wines.

Bedin- Family winery since 1948 when Giacomo Bedin planted his first vineyard just a short distance from Venice. His vision was to create a fine wine that reflected the true character of the grapes and the land, worthy of the most joyous of celebrations with family and friends. To this day, Bedin live and breathe this vision by producing quality sparkling wines that clearly reflect their origin. They blend the wine traditions handed down over generation with a modern approach, so that every bottle of Prosecco is highly crafter..... and easily enjoyed. As a family owned winery they are committed to protecting and nurturing their land for generations to come and to delivering uncompromising quality with their wines.

1.	Milani Pinot Grigio, Trentino (Italy) With its pale straw colour this wine exudes refreshing and elegant aromas of white fruits. It glides smoothly over the palate, offering deliciously fruity and juicy flavours.	€8.00 €30.00
2.	Patriarche Chardonnay (France) This medium-bodied cool-climate Chardonnay is full of vibrant green apple juiciness.	€8.50 €32.00
3.	Rhino Run Chenin Blanc ORGANIC (South Africa) This medium-bodied Chenin Blanc was created to honor the white rhino. The wine has aromas of peaches and floral notes that linger gently on the palate.	€8.50 €34.00
4.	Lagarto Pintado Albarino, Minho (Portugal) Inviting aromas of white peach and pear lead on to a smooth body and a finish that mingles a clean minerality with a tangy lime-scented crispness.	€9.50 €37.00

6.	Terranoble Cabernet Sauvignon (Chile) Super ripe fruit flavours of red berries, dark cherries and blackcurrants with soft tannins and a seriously long finish.	€8.00 €30.00
7.	Patriarche Merlot (France) Juicy autumnal fruit flavours of blackberry and damson with a smooth and mellow mouth-feel.	€8.50 €32.00
8.	Terre de Chieti Rosso, Abruzzo (Italy) ORGANIC A soft and approachable fruity wine with a distinct Italian character of red cherries with a nice smooth texture on the palate.	€8.50 €33.00
9.	Madrigal Malbec, Mendoza (Argentina) 90-year-old vineyards give this wine a finer and more elegant quality. It has rich, chocolatey dark fruit intensity with hints of pepper and spice.	€9.00 €35.00
10.	Mileto Rioja Crianza (Spain) Made mostly from hand-harvested Tempranillo grapes aged in oak barrels for 12 months, this is a deep cherry red with complex aromas of cherries, strawberries and toasty vanilla. Very tasty and very more-ish.	€9.50 €38.00

11. **Dezzani, Moscato d'Asti, Italy** €30.00
The color is straw yellow with bright highlights. The bouquet is fresh and intense with notes of fruit and sage. The taste is well balanced and very characteristic.
12. **Monslave Verdejo Rueda (Spain)** €32.00
Lovely summery Rueda. Citrussy, dry, some kiwi and apricot notes. Pale yellow of colour, fresh and crisp taste.
13. **Ardeche Par Nature White, Organic (France)** €34.00
Wonderful summer meadow fragrances and such vibrant fruity flavours of lemon and lime. Earthy notes of chamomile. The nose is discrete, the palate is lean and linear driven by zingy green fruit.
14. **Terrassen Gruner Veltliner, Traisental (Austria) ORGANIC** €42.00
Medium green yellow; pure pepper on the nose; hinting at typical Grüner spiciness; aromatic herbs and yellow fruit; dense and complex on the palate; great promise for the future.
15. **Ardora Maris Albarino, Rias Baixas, Galicia (Spain)** €42.00
It has a medium-high intensity. Very fruity, fresh, and fragrant offering very elegant notes of green apple.
16. **Dezzani Gavi, Piemonte (Italy)** €43.00
Scents of white peach and fruit blossom and on the palate it is full and powerful with a peachy, mineral, sapid quality.
17. **Macon Azé, Burgundy (France)** €43.00
A white burgundy made 100% from Chardonnay with baked apple, green apple and pear flavour. Weighty enough but crisp and fresh, too.
18. **Hexamer Dry Riesling, Nahe (Germany)** €43.00
A crisp, fresh and fruity Riesling with good body, tangy flavours of apricot, yellow peach, lemon and lime zest and an unmistakable herbal, mineral note.
19. **Fiano di Avellino, Campania (Italy)** €45.00
A weighty yet fresh wine made from hand-harvested grapes and aged on its lees for extra texture. Lovely peachy, herbal character.
20. **Chablis, Vocode, Burgundy (France) ORGANIC** €58.00
A classic Chablis with concentration, weight, minerality and finesse.
21. **Gerard Millet Sancerre, Loire Valley (France)** €58.00
A wonderfully delicate and elegant Sancerre with aromas of white summer flowers followed by flavours of white peaches and exotic fruits.

Red Wine

22. **Foundstone Shiraz (Australia)** €33.00
Concentrated fruity flavours of blackberry, black cherry and plum are supported by more complex flavours of coffee, vanilla and caramel from the oak-ageing.
23. **Stemmari Nero d'Avola, Sicily (Italy) ORGANIC** €34.00
A vibrantly fruity wine with real character and a distinctive red berry crispness and juiciness. It has some weight and depth and that typical Sicilian sour cherry, blackberry character.
24. **Amour de Libellule Cote Du Rhone (France) ORGANIC** €36.00
Produced with respect for nature, this wine seduces with its finesse, its intense fruity aromas, and its elegant structure. An ideal choice to accompany warm and friendly meals
25. **Jilguerín Tempranillo Ribera del Duero (Spain)** €39.00
Brilliant deep garnet. This is a vertical wine with perfect acidity, and smooth on the pallet. Easy to drink and enjoy along with some friends and tapas!
26. **Puy de Dome, St VERNY Pinot Noir (France)** €39.00
Such a pure and authentic flavour of France's Pinot Noir grape: cherry, strawberry and delicate nuances of wild raspberry.
27. **Domaine Robert Fleurie, Beaujolais (France)** €43.00
Fleurie is a great Irish favourite. This is full of rich of dark-berried fruits, it is nonetheless just medium-bodied as a Beaujolais should be.
28. **Baron de Ley Rioja Reserva (Spain)** €44.00
Made almost 100% from the Tempranillo grape and aged in American oak barrels for 20 months, this is a complex and elegant wine with dark fruit flavours, aromas of coffee and cream and a nice winter-warming spiciness.
29. **Cedro Chianti Rufina, Fattoria Lavacchio, Tuscany (Italy) ORGANIC** €44.00
A beautifully flavoursome Chianti that's rich and full-bodied and bursting with luscious dark-berried fruit flavours.
30. **Chateau de Parenchère Cuvée Raphael, Bordeaux (France)** €45.00
A richer, riper, fruitier style of Bordeaux, this special cuvée from Chateau de Parenchère has concentrated bramble fruit and cassis flavours and a vanilla note from the new oak barrels. Great depth and great length.
31. **Podere Don Cataldo, Primitivo, Puglia (Italy)** €47.00
Concentrated raisin, sultana, dried fig character with suggestions of coffee and cocoa. The pallet is full and the texture is silky smooth.

32. **Chateauneuf-du-Pape La Calice de Saint Pierre, Rhone Valley (France)** €75.00
Concentrated raspberry, black Cherry and damson jam aromas on the nose lead to intense autumnal fruit flavours on the palate. There is bags of rich, dense fruity character.
33. **Chateau Queyron Pindefleurs St Emilion Grand Cru (France)** €75.00
Made from mostly Merlot and Cabernet Franc grapes grown on the hillsides around St Emilion, this is elegant and rich with flavours of black cherry, damsons and raspberries.
34. **Duluc de Branaire Ducru, St Julien Bordeaux (France)** €90.00
A beautifully balanced Claret with wild bramble fruit flavours of raspberry and blackberries and just a touch of cedar wood. Lovely velvety tannins.
35. **La Dame de Malescot, Margaux, Bordeaux (France)** €100.00
Margaux is famed as the region of Bordeaux that has the most fragrant, perfumed and exotic of all wines. Dame de Malescot is lighter and more elegant than most with aromas of violets and crushed cherries and a beautiful silky mouthfeel.

38. **Siegel Naranjo (Chile)** €50.00
Gold in color, on the nose it presents sweetness with notes of spices, dried fruits, white flowers, and soft notes of dried peaches (Chilean huesillos). In the mouth, it has smooth acidity, with a good volume and some structure.

39. **Crucero Sauvignon Blanc (Chile)** €17.00
A crystal-clear pure fruitiness makes this wine stand out from the crowd. It's laden with pineapple and lemon and lime flavours.
40. **Pinot Grigio, Santa Sofia, Veneto (Italy)** €20.00
A superior example of the popular Pinot Grigio grape; this one is a full-bodied wine with luscious scents of peaches and apricots.
41. **Chablis, Domaine Charly Nicolle, Burgundy (France)** €30.00
A pale yellow with a perfume of summer flowers and a crisp minerality.
True, classic, authentic Chablis at its best.

42. **Crucero Cabernet Sauvignon (Chile)** €17.00
Blackcurrant and ripe fruits-of-the-forest flavours make this a rich and fruity wine with a subtle seasoning of vanilla.
43. **Lafond Cotes du Rhone, Rhone Valley (France) ORGANIC** €20.00
Strawberry and cherry jam aromas on the nose, baked fruits on the palate with a smooth texture.
44. **Domaine Robert Fleurie, Beaujolais (France)** €23.00
Fleurie is a great Irish favourite. This is full of rich of dark-berried fruits, it is nonetheless just medium-bodied as a Beaujolais should be.

Zero Alcohol Selection

45. **Leitz Zero Riesling (Germany)** €29.00
A crisp wine showing notes of lime and citrus fruit in the smell, as well as surprising notes of rhubarb, red apples and some mineralism. In taste, it has a delicate ease and freshness.
46. **Leitz Zero Cabernet (Germany)** €29.00
The Leitz zero alcohol cabernet sauvignon offers hints of ripe cassis and berry flavours as well as dark cherry flavour and aromas of black cherries, blueberries and chocolate with soft tannins and a dry finish.
47. **Layla Non Alcoholic Sparkling (Austria)** €34.00
A typical varietal aroma of lemon balm and tangerine peel. Fresh, clear and very balanced on the palate. Very animating thanks to a beautiful combination of minerality, lively acidity, fine perlage and sweet fruitiness.

48. **Bedin Prosecco Frizzante, (Italy)** €12.50 €39.00
Frizzante is a lightly sparkling wine, with more delicate bubbles than a spumante. This is a particularly fresh and aromatic example with a fine mousse and a long-lasting flavour.
49. **Bedin Prosecco Rosé Spumante (Italy)** €50.00
A subtle pale pink hue with perfumed scents of rose and eglantine. On the palate the flavours drift seamlessly from white peach and nectarine to crunchy red berries.
50. **Pares Balta Cava Brut NV, Penedes (Spain) ORGANIC** €55.00
A pure, lean and crystal clear organic Cava. It is classical and firm-bodied and (like all Cava) made by the Champagne Method. The bubbles are crisp and persistent and the flavour is of apples, pears and a touch of white peach . . . the perfect refreshing drink.
51. **Möet et Chandon Champagne (France)** €145.00
Hawthorn and honeysuckle aromas give way to the rich biscuity flavours of good quality Champagne. Quite full-bodied and dry.
52. **Dom Perignon Champagne (France)** €400.00
Perhaps the world's best-known luxury Champagne brand. It is rich, powerful and intense with the deep biscuity aromas that can only come from great care and long ageing before release.
